Keep up the great work room 23!

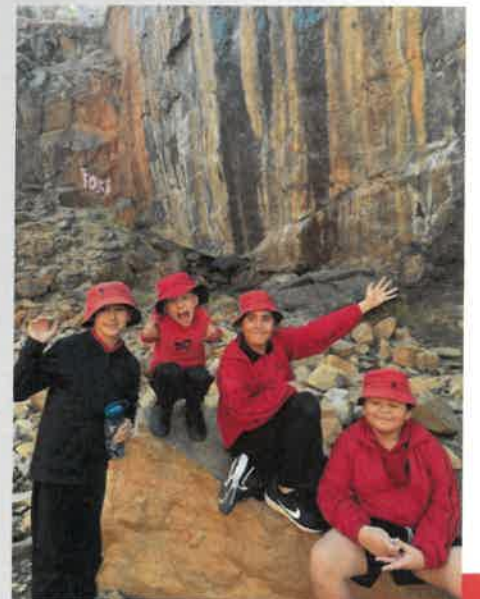




ROOM 24

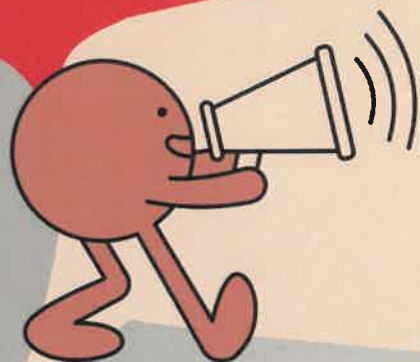




ROOM 26
